
Exception Reports are available for viewing in your reports when previewing your payroll, and also in Report Archive when the payroll is processed. The report provides key information about your account and payroll.

Types of Exceptions Reports

Every time you process your payroll, you are able to click on "Preview Payroll" to view any or all reports generated with the payroll. There are three types of "Exceptions" reports. They are:

- 1. Exceptions
- 2. Exceptions-InvalidTaxID
- 3. Exceptions Tax Variances

The reports are available in your drop-down menu under "Last Preview Results." Click on the **Go** icon to view the report.

The "Exceptions" report includes the following alerts or errors:

o Invalid SSN for W-2: Employee has an EIN or ITIN with W-2 data. This typically means that the employee has an ITIN or EIN listed on the General screen instead of a Social Security Number, which can cause issues with W-2 reporting if they are an employee and should receive a Form W-2 at year-end. If the independent contractor's EIN is correct, you may need to work with your support team to create an appropriate earning code for the contractor that will be included on form 1099-NEC.



- Tax Variances: Lists all taxable wages and calculated tax versus the actual tax collected from an employee for any taxes computed with a percentage. Some taxes you may see with variances are:
 - Social Security EE
 - o Medicare EE
 - SDIEE
 - o SUIEE



Negative Wages or YTD W2 Data: Includes negative wages, earnings, deductions.

This will give you the opportunity to view the alerts and make any corrections due to errors or omissions on the payroll or employer/employee information.

Tax variances can occur for many reasons. Some of the reasons are:

- Manual check with taxable wages and no without taxes entered in payroll.
- Refund of a Pre-tax deduction without adjustment for taxes.
- Taxable fringe benefit entered without a live check to collect the taxes on the fringe benefit amount.
- Social Security and Medicare not collected from employee due to insufficient Net Pay.
- Wages and/or deductions were voided in a quarter where there were no wages or few wages than the adjustment.
- A tax variance from prior balances from a previous Service Bureau.

If a tax variance exists, the funds may need to be collected from the employer if the employee is not receiving any additional wages, creating an undue cost to the employer. It is best to review the "Exceptions – Tax Variances" report each payroll. If you are not sure how to correct a Tax Variance, please contact your Service Bureau for guidance.
